### Career/Technical Field Goal = CTE Sequence Grad Pathway

- ✓ Complete 2.0 or more CTE credits in the same CTE program area<sup>1</sup> that either include a dual credit course, or lead to an industry recognized credential
- Complete a Core Plus program (Manufacturing, Construction and Maritime available)

### Military Career Goal = ASVAB Grad Pathway

✓ AFQT Section Score = 31 (check State Board of Education website by 9/1 annually)

### Postsecondary Education Goal = Complete math and English Language Arts (ELA) Grad Pathway

  - ✓ College Admissions Exams (ACT/SAT)

- ✓ Transition courses (1.0 credit total for math and/or ELA course over one school year)
  - Bridge to College courses (approved by state)
  - Locally articulation agreements between districts and sponsoring colleges
